

**ANNUAL PROGRESS REPORT****SESSION 2025-26****❖ Academic Report:**

The Academic Report for the session 2025–26 reflects the overall performance of students across all classes through various assessments conducted during the year. The results indicate strong performance in the primary classes, especially in the Half Yearly Examinations where Classes I and II achieved 100% pass percentage. Middle classes (VI to VIII) showed moderate and gradually improving performance, while senior classes (IX–XII) reflected average results, highlighting scope for further academic support and improvement.

The process for selecting the staff uniform for the upcoming session has been initiated. Preferences have been sought from the staff from various available options. The final uniform design and colour pattern will be finalized after further discussions and with due approval from the management.

### ❖ Infrastructure Status:

During the academic session 2025–26, several infrastructure development and maintenance works were undertaken to improve the facilities and ensure a safe, comfortable, and well-equipped learning environment for students and staff.

- A new RO water purification plant was installed to ensure the availability of clean and safe drinking water for students and staff.
- Plumbing work was carried out along with the installation of a 1000-litre water storage tank to improve the school's water supply system.
- A new water cooler was installed to provide clean and chilled drinking water on the school premises.
- New desk–bench sets were procured to enhance classroom organization and provide greater comfort for students during learning.
- To improve the overall infrastructure and aesthetic appeal of the campus, renovation works were undertaken, including external wall and boundary painting, sewage line improvements, and repair of school furniture.
- Safety railings were installed in the first and second-floor corridors to enhance student safety within the school premises.
- Advanced CCTV cameras were installed across the campus to strengthen security and surveillance systems.
- Two new LED TVs were installed in the Vice Principal's room for CCTV monitoring, and one LED TV was installed in the school office for displaying school activities.
- New school buses were purchased to enhance the transportation facility and ensure safe and comfortable travel for students.

### ❖ Review of Affiliation, Recognition (Manyata) and ISO 21001:2018 :

The institution continues to ensure compliance with all regulatory and quality standards required for effective academic administration and governance.

All necessary formalities for obtaining **the No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Directorate of Public Instruction (DPI)** have been duly completed.

The school's **CBSE affiliation** remains valid until 31<sup>st</sup> March 2027, and the process for extension of affiliation has already been initiated, demonstrating the institution's proactive approach toward maintaining uninterrupted academic recognition.

Additionally, the school's **RTE (Right to Education) affiliation** has been extended until the year 2028, reflecting the institution's continued commitment to inclusive and equitable education.

In the current academic session, we were certified under ISO 9001:2015, reflecting our commitment to maintaining quality standards in educational management. For the upcoming session, the institution has opted to transition to the **ISO 21001:2018 Educational Organization Management System**. As part of this process, an external audit was conducted in February 2026. The audit has been successfully completed, and the school is currently awaiting the official certification, which will further strengthen its educational quality management system and support continuous improvement.

❖ **Recommendations for Academic Session 2026–27:**

We are proposing the following initiatives to further enhance the academic, co-curricular, and infrastructural standards of the institution, for kind consideration and approval by the management:

1. **Introducing IB Curriculum:** We suggest introducing the International Baccalaureate (IB) curriculum alongside the existing CBSE program to provide students with broader academic exposure and global learning opportunities.
2. **New Optional Subjects for Senior Classes:** We propose offering **Entrepreneurship** and **Psychology** as optional subjects for Classes XI and XII, aimed at developing students' analytical, creative, and vocational skills.
3. **Integrated Academic Programs:** We propose starting integrated courses such as JEE, NEET, and other competitive exam preparation programs to support the higher education aspirations of our students.
4. **Upgradation of Student Restrooms:** We suggest expanding and enhancing student restroom facilities to ensure hygiene, comfort, and convenience for all students.
5. **Multipurpose Hall:** It is proposed to develop a multipurpose hall to provide a dedicated space for indoor activities, cultural events, assemblies, and student gatherings. This will maximize the use of available space, reduce dependency on outdoor grounds, and support year-round activities regardless of weather conditions, thereby enhancing the overall student experience.
6. **Renovation of Principal and Vice Principal Chambers:** We suggest renovating and modernizing the Principal and Vice Principal offices to create a more organized and professional environment. Upgraded facilities will support efficient administrative operations, enable smooth coordination with staff and parents, and reflect the leadership standards of the institution, contributing to overall institutional effectiveness.
7. **Installation of Solar Power Plant:** To promote renewable energy and reduce the school's carbon footprint, it is proposed to install a solar power plant. This initiative will contribute to sustainable development goals, provide clean energy, lower electricity costs, and create an eco-friendly learning environment.
8. **Rainwater Harvesting System:** Implementing a rainwater harvesting system is suggested to conserve water and encourage students to practice responsible water management. This initiative aligns with the school's commitment to environmental sustainability and resource efficiency.
